

# **Policy 1960-1d**

## **Table of Organization**

Policy 1960-1d establishes the formal table of organization for Project Negentropy, a confidential long-range preservation and recovery program administered by Dustin-Rhodes Corporation.

The Project maintains selected personnel, technical equipment, protected archives, industrial assets, and reserve logistical systems intended to preserve human knowledge and productive capacity during periods of severe disruption.

Ultimate authority for Project Negentropy rests with the Board of Directors of Dustin-Rhodes Corporation. Operational control is delegated through the Director of Project Negentropy to the chiefs of the numbered departments.

Project Negentropy is organized into six permanent departments. Department 6 conducts field operations and deploys Troubleshooter teams. Supporting departments provide administration, research, logistics, personnel development, and strategic planning.

### **Numbered Departments**

#### **Department 1 — Administration and Records**

Maintains classified archives, legal files, personnel records, correspondence, and document control.

#### **Department 2 — Research and Development**

Designs and evaluates X-technology, advanced equipment, and experimental systems.

#### **Department 3 — Supply and Logistics**

Procures, stores, transports, and issues equipment, vehicles, batteries, rations, and technical kits.

#### **Department 4 — Personnel Selection and Training**

Conducts recruitment, screening, physical and psychological evaluation, and advanced instruction.

### **Department 5 — Strategic Analysis and Planning**

Maintains long-range forecasts, contingency plans, and recovery scenarios.

### **Department 6 — Field Operations**

Deploys Troubleshooter teams and directs operational missions in the field.

## **Department 6 Operational Divisions**

Department 6 personnel are assigned to one of four operational divisions. These divisions provide the core specialties normally represented in Troubleshooter teams.

### **Operations Division**

Mission command, communications, tactical planning, and field coordination.

### **Engineering Division**

Mechanical, electrical, civil, and industrial recovery operations.

### **Medical Division**

Human and veterinary medicine, sanitation, and epidemiology.

### **Investigation Division**

Forensics, intelligence, archaeology, anthropology, and criminalistics.

## **Troubleshooter Teams**

Troubleshooter teams are small, self-contained operational units capable of extended independent activity.

A standard team normally includes representatives from the Operations, Engineering, Medical, and Investigation Divisions, though actual composition may vary according to mission requirements.

All team members are volunteers operating under the informed consent provisions of Department 6 policy and are selected through the multi-phase personnel evaluation and training program.

When operational service becomes impractical, personnel are offered continued employment within Dustin-Rhodes Corporation whenever possible.
